Smartphone Redux

Who needs a computer when you own a smartphone or an iPad? Even though I love my LG 8360, my wife tells me that I should turn it in for an iPhone like the one she plans to buy. For my wife to consider the purchase of an iPhone when she rarely carries or uses her current, simple cell phone that limits her use to making phone calls illustrates the seductive nature of technology today.

Here are several new apps for those of you who already own smartphones. The National Park Service, www.nps.gov/nama/photosmultimedia/app-page.htm just announced the release of a free app for iPhones and iPads, with Android apps to follow shortly, that allows visitors to Washington D.C. to explore many of the National Park Service cultural and historical sites.

The app features a list of current events in and around the National Mall. In addition, an interactive map allows you to identify walkways easily distinguished from roads and provides a suggested route that is easy to follow using a zoom feature and a “locate me” icon on your handset. And the map allows you to create an individualized tour just by tapping the interactive screen.

An even neater feature allows you to hold up the device and look through the activated camera view to see labels that identify all the sites on the mall. The site conveniently provides a QR Code that takes you directly to the iTunes Store to download the free app.

Social Responsibility Easily Afforded

Another example of your federal taxes at work comes from the Environmental Protection Agency at www.appsfortheenvironment.challenge.gov/submissions. The agency recently initiated a contest to find the most useful app related to the environment using EPA data. This challenge encourages software developers to write code using EPA data delivered to the public in an app. Developers submitted a number of apps including the following.

The app, CG Search, is a mobile green IT program that allows users from all over the country to know and to compare air quality index, air pollutant levels and energy consumption of various cities with Atlanta. Another app is The Green Gumshoe. This app brings local communities and government together to maintain a safe and clean environment.

For gamers, Joulebug, rewards players for reducing energy consumption. Playing the game encourages players to make energy conservation a habit. At my visit, the Apps for the Environment contest had only one more day to vote for the best app.

The www.challenge.gov site encourages the public and government to work together to solve problems. This site promotes a number of federal agencies to develop responsible solutions for health issues, environmental issues and airport design. Some of the contests provide cash awards to winning individuals and institutions.

Market Investor Help

If you are worried about your investments as the stock market oscillates wildly, a visit to www.wallstreet.com may provide some relief for jangled nerves. This site operates around the clock streaming up-to-the-second stock prices, blogs, mutual funds, banking, bonds and investment clubs. In addition, the site often provides articles of interest to socially conscious investors. For example, a recent article listed large American companies that exclude women and minorities from boards of directors.

The article highlighted HCA, a healthcare company; L-3 a defense contractor; Pilgrim's Pride, a poultry firm; and Sonic Automotive, a car retailer, as examples of large companies which had neither women nor minorities on their boards of directors.

For Those With Too Much Time To Waste

Members of the cognoscenti keep their edge by visiting sites like www.buzzfeed.com to ferret-out what's in and what's not. A recent post included men photographed in classic pin-up poses. To view this hilarious sendup click on www.buzzfeed.com/jpmoore/men-ups-manly-men-in-classic-pin-up-poses. If this is not to your liking, click on buzzfeed.com to view other strange and/or funny posts such as “16 Bizarre Things You Can Pay To Smell Like” on a link to metalfloss.com. Featured fragrances include bacon, Play-doh, Donald Trump, Stilton Cheese or The Laundromat. I have no explanation for these smells or for why anyone would pay money to smell like any of this. Maybe I'm just too old to get it.

Did You Know . . . — Donna Gorrell

. . . that you could print pages so that the first page will be on top of the stack in your printer? Doesn't matter if you are using Word or WordPerfect. Click File, then Print from the menu bar. Make sure your printer is selected [I have use of three printers and each one has its own settings]. Then go to Properties. Look for something that says Print in Reverse Order. Your printer might have different wording. Put a check mark in the box. Next time you print a multiple page document the pages should come out with page #1 on top of the stack.

. . . that Windows 7 has a variety of power plans that can help optimize the battery life of a laptop? Click the battery icon in the System Tray; then click More Power Options. In the Power Options window click the Show Additional Plans arrow to show all the options available. Look for the Extended Battery Life [Max Run Time] option. Click the radio button to select that option and close the dialog box. You can repeat this process to select other power plans.

. . . that XP has a similar power plan? Right click on the desktop, choose Properties from the list that pops up. In the dialog box that appears, click on the Screen Saver tab, then click on the Power button at the bottom under Monitor Power. You can then choose to adjust the various settings to your liking. Be aware that I have my monitor and disc set to turn off after 15 minutes and I have to go back to the dialog box frequently because Microsoft seems to think that after a few days I no longer want the computer do this.

. . . that you could use Firefox or Internet Explorer to send a link from a webpage by email to someone? In Firefox, click File, Send Link. You get a new email message [in your default mail program] with the page name in the Subject line and the link already pasted into the body. Choose your recipient(s), add a note if you wish, and click Send. In IE, click Page, Send Link by email. Don't confuse this with the nearby Send Page by E-mail option, which embeds the entire Web page in the body of your email, not just a link.
